- 1. This Select Committee was appointed by Resolution of the National Assembly dated 20th September 1973 "to review the Standing Orders".

- 3. Up to the date of this Report there have been Eleven Meetings of the Committee.
- 4. The Committee has received, in addition to suggestions from its own Members, written representations from the Hon. Chief Kitonga, M.P., and the Hon. A. Araru, M.P., for which the Committee is grateful.
- 5. The amendments of Standing Orders which the Committee recommends are set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 6. During the course of its deliberations, the Committee inevitably touched upon matters relating to the powers, privileges and immunities of the House. Although not required to do so by its terms of reference, the Committee respectfully recommends that a Select Committee be appointed in due course to probe and report on the vast and vexed question of Parliamentary privilege.

7. Finally, to facilitate effective implementation of these recommendations, especially with regard to the committee system, and to ensure that the Legislature plays its full part in the ramified process of regulating the affairs of a modern State, it is necessary that the Clerk's Department be reorganized and its establishment expanded. The Committee particularly notes with concern the difficulty encounted in attracting qualified and retaining experienced senior staff, owing to inadequate recognition of their status consequent upon general ignorance and apathy about the requirements of a Farliamentary institution.

The Committee therefore recommends that appropriate action be taken forthwith to improve the terms of service and emoluments attaching to the posts of Assistant Clerks, particular regard being had to the specialized nature of their work and the fact that the body which they serve is the supreme legislative body in the Nation and the ultimate repository of the sovereign power which exists in all systems of government.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Amendments of Standing Orders Recommended by the Select Committee

- 1. That the <u>Prayer</u> be amended by substituting the word "Republic" for the word "land" in the last line of the first paragraph.
- 2. That Standing Order 4 (3) be corrected by substituting the figures "34" and "35" for the figures "40" and "41" respectively in the ninth line thereof.
- 3. That Standing Order 7 be amended -
 - (a) in paragraph (1), by inserting the words "or sixty Members" immediately after the word "Government" in the fourth line;
 - (b) in paragraph (2), by inserting the words "or the Members so requisitioning the House" between the words "Government" and "may" in the sixth line.

- (1) At the commencement of every Parliament, or from time to time as necessity may arise, Mr. Speaker shall with the approval of the House nominate three Members (not being Ministers) who shall be known respectively as the First, Second and Third Chairman of Committees, and who shall be entitled to exercise all the powers vested in the Chairman of Committees including his powers as Deputy Speaker.
- (2) The Members nominated in accordance with the preceding paragraph shall constitute the Chairmen's Panel.
- That Standing Order 17 be amended by leaving out "at 9 a.m. on Fridays and", in paragraph (1), and by making consequential amendments throughout the Standing Orders.

That Standing Order 25 be amended by adding a new para-6. graph thereto as follows: Whenever the House has to adjourn for lack of a quorum, the names of all the Members present at the time of the adjourment shall be entered in the Official Report of the House. 7. That Standing Order 33 be amended in the third line of the first proviso, by substituting "Wednesday" for "Friday": in both paragraphs (a) and (b) of the second (b) proviso, by the insertion respectively of the words "or supported by at least thirty Members" between the words "by any party" and "shall have precedence" thereof. That Standing Order 35 be amended by the addition thereto S. of a new paragraph as follows -Upon receiving a Question, the Minister shall (6)within the period specified in the preceding paragraphs of this Standing Order and in Standing Order 39 submit to the Clerk fifteen, in the case of a private notice or an oral Question, and six, in the case of a written Question, copies of the reply. 9.  - (a) the extent to which they have been implemented; and
 - (b) whether such implementation has taken place within the minimum time necessary for the purpose.

Standing 149. Orders Committee

- (1) There shall be a select committee to be known as the Standing Orders Committee shall comprise Mr. Speaker as Chairman, the Deputy Speaker and not more than ten other Members appointed by the Sessional Committee at the commencement of every Session.
- (2) It shall be the duty of the Committee to consider from time to time and report on all matters relating to these Standing Orders.
- Standing 150. Select Committees
- (1) There shall be Standing Select Committees which shall be nominated by the Sessional Committee at the commencement of every Parliament.
- (2) Unless the House otherwise orders, the following such committees shall be appointed -
 - (i) Committee on Legislation (including Justice, Constitutional and Legal Affairs).
 - (ii) Committee on Economic Planning and Environmental Affairs (including Economic Development and Water Development).

- (viii) Committee on Works, Power and Communications.
- (ix) Committee on Defence and Foreign
 Relations.
- (x) Committee on Natural Resources (including Forests, Mineral Resources, Wildlife and Fisheries).
- (3) It shall be the duty of the committees referred to in the preceding paragraph to investigate and enquire into the activities and administration of such Ministries or Departments as they may consider necessary and such investigation and enquiry may extend to proposals for legislation.
- That the new <u>Standing Order 152</u> be amended by adding thereto a new paragraph, as follows -

22.

- (3) In nominating such Members the Sessional Committee or the House, as the case may be, shall have regard to the qualifications of the Members nominated, and shall have power to vary the composition of the committees as and when it deems fit.
- 23. That a new <u>Standing Order 161</u> added immediately after the new <u>Standing Order 160</u>, as follows -

Power to 161. summon witnesses

Any committee appointed under these Standing Orders may, subject to the provisions of the National Assembly (Powers and Privileges) Act, order any person to attend before such committee and to give evidence or to produce any paper, book, record or document in the possession or under the control of such person.

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Note: (For information only) The following <u>Standing Order 4(10)</u>, adopted by the House on 16th July 1969, was inadvertently omitted from the printed copies of the current Standing Orders -

(10) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary hereinbefore appearing, if there is only one candidate who has been duly nominated, that condidate shall be declared forthwith to have been elected Speaker, without any ballot or minimum vote being required.
