TRANSFER OF STORES AND EQUIPMENT
TO BOARDS OF GOVERNORS OF AFRICAN
SCHOOLS AND TEACHER TRAINING COLLEGES

Part VI of the Education Ordinance, 1952, provides for the establishment of Boards of Governors for Government Schools, and by the "Boards of Governors for Government Schools Order, 1958," published as Legal Notice No. 541 of 1958, Boards were established for twelve African secondary schools and six African teacher training colleges.

2. These Boards are now assuming responsibility for the day to day financial control hitherto exercised by the Director of Education, and it is accordingly necessary that the stores and equipment held by the schools should cease to be accounted for as Government stores and should become the property of the Boards of Governors to whom, therefore, it is proposed to transfer such stores and equipment.

3. A schedule is attached which shows the approximate value of the property held at each institution concerned which it is proposed to transfer to the Board of Governors established for that institution.
