Executive Summary

The Annual Development Plan (ADP) 2014-2015 is the first development plan for the county under the new dispensation. The plan was prepared by making reference to the County Integrated Development Plan and the Kitui County Profile. It is a response to the development challenges of the County and it articulates the opportunities available for development and presents programmes and projectsthat were implemented in financial year 2013-2014 and those which will be implemented in 2014-2015 financial year. All this is aimed at up lifting Kitui County residents to a better life.

This Annual Development Plan document has 4chapters

Chapter Oneis the general county information which provides description of the County in terms of the location, size, physiographic and natural conditions, demographic profiles as well as the administrative and political units. It also explains the objective of the Annual Development Plan.County planning is anchored in law. Section 107 of the County Governments Act, 2012 clearly stipulates the types of plans to be prepared by all county governments. It further details the methodology used in preparing the plan.

Chapter Two presents briefinformation of the county ministries, Ministerial progress reports on projects and programmes implemented in 2013/204 financial year. It finally outlines the challenges encountered during implementation of projects and further gives recommendations.

ChapterThreepresents highlight of projects and programmes from all the ministries as identified in various forums including, community participation, line departments and stakeholders' forums which will be implemented in 2014/2015 financial year.

Chapter Four is the final part of the plan and gives the conclusion , overall recommendations and appendices.

CHAPTER ONE

COUNTY GENERAL INFORMATION

1.0 Introduction

The Annual development Plan provides the description of the County in terms of the location, size, physiographic and natural conditions, demographic profiles as well as the administrative and political units. It also gives the ecological conditions and climatic conditions of Kitui County. The ADP lays the foundation and sets the tone for priority projects and programmes to address the development challenges that face the implementation of the projects and programmes.

1.1 Position and Size

Kitui County is one of the 47 counties in the country located about 160km east of Nairobi City. It is one of the largest counties in the country, covering an area of 30,496.4 km² including 6,369 km² occupied by Tsavo East National park. The County shares its borders with 7 other counties: Machakos and Makueni Counties to the west, Tana River County to the east and south-east, Taita Taveta County to the south, Embu to the north-west, and Tharaka-Nithi and Meru Counties to the north. It is located between latitudes $0^{\circ}10^{\circ}$ and $3^{\circ}0^{\circ}$ south and longitudes $37^{\circ}50^{\circ}$ and $39^{\circ}0^{\circ}$ east.

1.2 Physiographic and Natural Conditions

1.2.0 Physical and Topographic Features

Kitui County has a low lying topography and its climate is arid and semi-arid with very erratic and unreliable rainfall. The highlands namely, Migwani, Mumoni, Kitui Central, Mui, Mutitu Hills and Yatta plateau receive relatively high rainfall compared with lowlands of Nguni, Kyuso and Tseikuru. Due to their altitudes, they receive more rainfall than other areas in the County and are the most productive areas. The topography of the County can be divided into hilly rugged uplands and lowlands. The general landscape is flat with a plain that gently rolls down towards the east and northeast where altitudes are as low as 400 metres. The altitude of the Kitui County ranges between 400m and 1800m above sea level. The central part of the County is characterised by hilly ridges separated by wide low lying areas and has slightly lower elevation of between 600m and 900m above sea level to the eastern side of the County. To the western side of the County, the main relief feature is the Yatta Plateau, which stretches from the north to the south of the County and lies between Rivers Athi and Tiva. The plateau is characterised by plain wide shallow spaced valleys.

Apart from the Yatta Plateau and the range of hills in the central part of the County, the topography is undulating, and gives way to plains toward the east. A few hills rise as inselbergs in the plains rising to an altitude of 1,747 metres above sea level. These isolated hills usually affect communication within the County. The generally flat relief of the Kitui County provides an opportunity for low cost of installing/building of infrastructure such as roads and power lines. It also means putting up buildings is relatively cheaper due to low landscaping costs as compared to counties that have steep slopes and unstable soils.

1.2.1 Ecological Conditions

The County of Kitui is endowed with various natural resources such as forests, permanent and seasonal rivers, hills, rocks, wildlife among others. Apart from the natural resources, the county can also be divided into four main agro ecological zones which include: Semi-Arid farming zone, Semi-arid ranching areas, Arid-Agro-pastoral area and Arid-Pastoral Zone. The Semi-Arid farming zone is

further classified into various smaller zones such as; UM3 which is very small (in pockets); UM3-4 the transitional marginal coffee zone around Migwani and Kitui Central. The UM4 is considered as the sunflower- maize zone or Pigeon peas-maize zone. LM3 is the cotton zone, is very small and many are steep slopes mainly for forest reserves, while LM4 is marginal cotton zone. LM5 is the livestock-millet zone which is suitable for livestock and millet production.

The Semi-Arid Ranching Areas are less fertile and are currently used for drought resistance crops and livestock keeping.LM6 and IL6 are the Semi-arid ranching zones in which no rain-fed agriculture is suitable except with runoff-catching techniques. IL5 is suitable for both livestock and millet production. These semi-arid zones have good potential for agricultural development and are currently either cultivated or lying fallow under woodland. Due to population pressure the less fertile semi-arid ranching areas are currently used for production of food crops and livestock keeping which leads to frequent crop failures as these areas are not suitable for growing of certain crops under rain-fed agriculture. The Arid-Agro-Pastoral areas are generally suitable for grazing. Finally, the Arid-Pastoral Zones are suitable for rearing of livestock.

1.2.2 Climatic Conditions

The climate of the Kitui County is hot and dry with unreliable rainfall. The climate falls under two climatic zones i.e., arid and semi-arid with most of the County being classified as arid. The County experiences high temperatures throughout the year, ranging from 14°C to 34°C. The hot months are between September and October to January and February. The maximum mean annual temperature ranges between 26°C and 34°C whereas the minimum mean annual temperature ranges between 14°C and 22°C. July is the coldest month with temperatures falling to a low of 14°C while the month of September is normally the hottest with temperature rising to a high of 34°C.

Due to the high temperatures experienced in the county throughout the yearthe rate of evaporation is high with a mean annual potential evaporation in the central and north-western regions of the county ranging between 1800 to 2000mm while in eastern and north-eastern regions, the range is from 2200 to 2400mm. The bulk of the County falls within 1800 to 2200mm range.

The rainfall pattern is bi-modal with two rainy seasons annually. The long rains fall in the months of March to May. These are usually very erratic and unreliable. The short rains which form the second rainy season fall between October and December and are more reliable. The rest of the year is dry and the annual rainfall ranges between 250mm-1050 mm per annum with 40% reliability for the long rains and 66% reliability for the short rains. Rainfall is highly unpredictable from year to year.

1.3 Administrative Units

1.3.1Administrative Units (sub-counties and County Assembly wards)

Kitui County has 8 sub-counties namely; Kitui Central, Kitui West, Kitui East, Kitui South, Kitui Rural, Mwingi North, Mwingi Central and Mwingi West. It also has forty (40) wards .The sub-counties are administrated by the Sub-county Administrators and the wards by the ward administrators.

The county intends to recruit village administrators to oversee the villages which will be the lowest level of the county administrative units.

Table 1 below shows the sub-counties and the wards in each sub-county within Kitui.

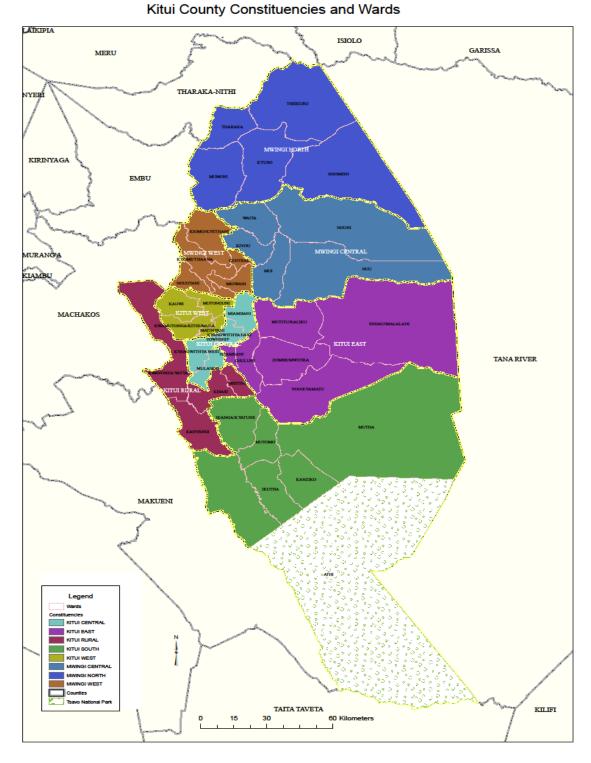


Figure 1: Map of the Kitui Countyby administrative units

1.4 Demographic Features

1.4.1 Population Size and Composition

Population dynamics form an integral part of socio-economic and cultural development for the County. The County's population was 1,012,709 according to the population and household census report of 2009. The report showed that 531,427 were females while 481,282 were males and this was expected to grow to 1,065,330 by 2013. The population growth rate of the County at 2.1% is slightly lower than the national rate of 2.6%. High population exerts pressure on social and natural resources, and it is imperative for the County to develop strategies in addressing the low growth rate. Table 2 provides information on the County population projections by gender and age cohorts with 2009 as the base year. The figures are given at intervals for ease of analysis and planning.

The County has a high population of children, as shown in the 2009 census report, where the population between the ages of 0-14 years, was 238,928 male and 232,820 females which represented 46.6% of the total population. The population between 65-80 years was 23,391

males and 29,449 females translating to 5.2% of the entire population. This implies a higher dependency of children between 0-14 years than elderly population between 65-80 years. The County should take note of this because it means that there are more people to feed, more schools to build and pressure to create more employment opportunities.

The census shows that there were 81,525 males and 79,977 females in the age cohort 0-4 years, 32,655 males and 40,691 females in the age cohort 20-24 years. This implies that transition from infant to teenage is higher for females than males and thus there is higher mortality for males than females in the County. These statistics tally with normal demographic structures. This also means that the county health authorities should focus on the causes of infant mortality to ensure that male children transition to teenage is improved.

Table 3 provides the population projections of selected age groups of under 1, under 5, (6-13)primary school going age group, 14-17 (secondary school age group), the youth 15-19 age group, the reproductive age (15-49) for females, the labour force 15-64 and the aged 65+.

(a) Age group 0- 1 year: There were 32,435 children in 2009 projected to increase by 6.4% to 33,919 in 2013. This calls for special interventions in order to significantly reduce the high Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) which presently stands at 84/1000 deaths against 52/1000 deaths

for the national status. The County should put in place nutrition programmes for pregnant and lactating mothers and their children, to reduce the infant mortality rate. Maternal, Infant and Young child feeding programmes should be intensified to increase the immunity of infants.

- (b) Age Group Under 5: This comprised 161,502 children in 2009 projected to increase to 168,890 in the year 2013. As this is the pre-school age, it is necessary to build more day care centres and pre-primary schools for the younger generation. This population group is also vulnerable to diseases and therefore immunization programmes should be stepped up for them. Both the ministries of Health and Sanitation and Basic Education & Skills Development have proposed initiatives that cater to this age cohort and aim to improve their welfare significantly in order to reduce the rate of mortality and address welfare issues affecting them.
- (c) Primary School Age Group (6-13 Years): The population of primary school going age was 248,483 in the year 2009 and projected to increase to 261,615 by the year 2013 representing a 6% increase. There is need to provide necessary facilities, such as classrooms, boarding facilities, learning materials, recruitment of teachers and construction of more schools to cater for the needs of this age group. The County should also consider a school feeding programme to promote intake of essential nutrients. In addition, school health programmes should be stepped up in order to reduce school dropout due to health related issues.
- (d) Secondary School Age Group (14-17 Years): The population of the secondary school age group was 106,316 in 2009 and was expected to increase to 111,995 by end of 2013. This implies that the transition rate from primary to secondary school is low .The county should develop strategies to improve on the transition rate by expanding the necessary facilities, such as classrooms, boarding facilities, learning materials, recruit teachers and more schools, as well as improving the existing ones, to cater for the needs of this age group and attain high quality education. It should also lobby for compulsory secondary education due to the existence of the subsidized Secondary education programme as well as providing for bursaries for the poor students in its annual budget.
- (e) Female Reproductive Age Group (15-49 Years): This cohort represents the reproductive age for women where in 2009. The age group accounted for 231,344 of the total population in the County in 2009 with an expected increase of 242,395 and 246,300 in 2013 and 2015 respectively. This anticipated increase will require enhanced interventions in terms of maternal care services. The total fertility rate for the Kitui County is 5.3%, teenage pregnancy (15 − 19 yrs.) stands at 14% and over 30% of the above population are married before the age of 18 years. Family planning programmes such as the Output Based Aid (OBA) project should be stepped up to increase choice on the number of children women want to give birth to. A programme should also be initiated to encourage girls to continue

with education post primary school so as to reduce on early pregnancy and marriages. The law against marrying underage girls should be enforced to stop the school dropout trends.

- (f) Labour Force Age Group (15-64 Years): As of the last census, the County labour force stood at 487,648 people, which was 40% of the total population, and was projected to be 514,133 by 2013. Women constitute 56.7% of the total population in the group and males constitute the remaining 43.3%. High unemployment levels among the youth and rural-urban migration are some of the associated challenges of this cohort. Drug abuse is a major challenge amongst the unemployed youth particularly the use of khat. The County should foster an environment for skills development and employment creation to reduce levels of unemployment.
- (g) Aged population (65+): In 2009, this age cohort had 52,840 people of which 23,391 were male and 29,449 were female. This population was projected to be 55,663 in 2013, 24,845 being male and 30,818 being female. This cohort is largely dependent on the working labour force since they are not economically productive and therefore if not supported adequately, can exert a heavy economic burden on the County. Specific interventions such as cash transfer funds and social protection programmes should be invested in to address the dependency of this population cohort.

1.4.2 Population density and distribution

1.4.2.1 Population Density

The population patterns and distribution in the County are largely influenced by landholding and ownership, availability and accessibility of water, and fertility of soils. The current trend in the County is that more people tend to concentrate on foot hills and plateaus where agriculture is possible. Other settlements are concentrated near towns due to the availability of reliable social amenities and employment opportunities. Climatic conditions have also influenced the settlement patterns, and the majority of people live in scattered settlements with only 5% living in an urban environment. The most densely populated area is Kitui Central with 208 persons per km² and the lowest is Kitui East with 25 persons per km². The County average is 44 persons per km². With the exception of the areas bordering the Tana River County, which experience cattle rustling and banditry the rest of the County does not have any major human conflicts.

The Kitui Town is approximately twice as populous as Mwingi Town and is expected to be so even by the year 2015. It is anticipated that with the development of the Special Economic Zones, the exploitation of coal in Mui basin and limestone in Mutha, more towns will eventually emerge due to high migration into the County and increased economic activity. Table 4 below shows the most densely populated Sub counties which is currently led by Kitui Central.

Table 4 shows that by 2015, Kitui Central will be more densely populated than all the other eight Sub counties. It can further be indicated that due to coal exploration in Mui basin and Limestone in Mutomo; Mwingi Central, Kitui East and Kitui South Sub counties may have a high influx of people due to pull factors necessitated by economic activities associated with the investment and associated employment opportunities

1.4.2.2 Population Projections by Urban Centres

An urban centre as defined in the Cities and Urban Centres Act 2012 is a town with a population between 10,000 and 250,000 people. In Kitui County, only two towns currently qualify as urban centres - Kitui and Mwingi. Table 5 below shows population of the two urban centres as of the 2009 population census and the projections for 2013, 2015 and 2017.

1.4.2.3 Population projections by Sub – County / Constituency

The population of Kitui County is fairly spread out in each of the sub-counties. The highest population in the County is in Kitui South and the lowest is in Kitui West Sub-County. Generally females are more than males by 52.4% against 47.6% respectively. The higher population of women calls for deliberate interventions to address gender inequality such as education, access to land rights, improved maternal health, provision of credit for women and women empowerment on human rights.

Table 6 below gives a breakdown of population projections by each Sub-County/ constituency and gender. Such information is important for gender based programming in the County and putting strategies in place to effect gender equality.

1.5 0Objectives of Annual Development Plan (ADP)

County planning is anchored in law. Section 107 of the County Governments Act, 2012 clearly stipulates the types of plans to be prepared by all county governments. These plans are the

County Integrated Development plan (CIDP) which lays down a county's Five years development plan, county sectoral plans, county spatial plans and cities and urban areas plans as provided for under the Urban Areas and Cities Act (No. 13 of 2011).

The Public Fianance Management Act, 2012 Section 126 (1) stiputes how the ADPs are prepared and when they are supposed to be submitted to County Assembly for discussion and possible approval. ADPs are therefore undertaken by counties in the process of implementing these plans. They are produced with the intention of reporting on the implementation process as well as to serve as means of evaluating any progress made. This is considered as the preliminary step towards setting the agenda for the following year. Towards achieving these objectives, an ADP seeks to analyze three fundamental areas which entail providing an evaluation of the performance and analysis of outturns, projecting an overview of the preceeding year's policy intentions and highlighting significant feedback on how specific shortcomings indentified in previous implementation stages can be addressed.

1.6 **Development Challenges**

The ADP seeks to address the myriad development challenges of the county that include: food insecurity; water scarcity; low prioritization of preventive health care, low education standards; low access and adaptation of modern information, communication and technologies (ICT); low electricity and power connectivity, unexploited mineral wealth, untapped tourism potential, inadequate frameworks for nurturing talents, skills and innovation; poor savings and investment culture; weak commercial and industrial base; ineffective public mobilization and participation; poorly planned and lit urban centres; weak socio-economic linkages between rural and urban areas; poor roads and transport infrastructure; inadequate and poorly mapped revenue resource base; inadequate institutional stakeholder mapping and coordination; insufficient human resource capacity; youth unemployment and inequitable development and marginalization; among others.

1.7 Methodology of Preparation of the ADP

The county adopts a comprehensive approach to planning, which covers strategic and medium term planning with both directive and indicative components. The Annual development plan originates from the CIDP which formulated a long-term development perspective that determines development priorities, potential challenges, and possible future growth paths in the light of expected developments in the entire county.

Preparation of the plan includes: preparing operating manuals to assist ministries/departments the guidelines to be followed when preparing the plan, conducting studies to support the plan; providing the required statistical databases and information for monitoring and analysis;

conducting field visits to various regions; providing economic models which are necessary planning tools; and intensifying consultation and coordination with county ministries..

The ADP was prepared by County ministries progress reports which were used in preparation of the 2013/2014 annual development plan. The work entailed performing desk-based research and actual writing of the ADP. This is in regard to the development of an institutional framework for county M&E system which seeks to address indicator construction and data storage as well as monitoring of projects and improvement in dissemination of information on county plans implementation.

The Annual Development Plan was compiled by the department of Economic Planning in the county ministry of Finance and Economic Planning.

The information/data used to prepare the 2014 ADP will be vital in the preparation of 2015 annual Development Plan.

2.3.4Implementation Challenges

The ministry has experienced a number of challenges which dampened the attainment of the strategic goals for the period. These include;

- i) Centralization of resources in a common pool at the County headquarters constraining access hence affect; mobility, projects/programme implementation, payment for recurrent expenditures at subsequent levels,
- ii) Lengthy procurement procedures which delay timely implementation of Ministry's planned projects
- iii) Inadequate staff Capacity building at the advent of devolved system of governance and silence on upward mobility puts seconded staff in unhealthy suspense, hence a potential threat to quality of service delivery
- iv) Subsidy for electricity bills for water companies, inherited from National government, illegitimately eats into the Ministry's budget; yet it was not budgeted for, consuming resources meant for implementing various projects for the ministry

- v) Inadequate awareness among communities on the new structures to deliver devolved functions affect workflow and delivery of agricultural extension service
- vi) Service providers in the agriculture sector operating in uncoordinated manner.
- vii) Inadequate office space, furniture and equipments.
- viii) Inadequate transport facilities
- ix) Inadequate technical and support staff.
- x) Dependency syndrome among farming communities.
- xi) Low resource base among farming communities.

2.3.5 Recommendations

- i) Decentralized financial resources to sub county levels
- ii) Improve transport facilities for the implementers
- iii) Facilitate participative planning for effective and efficient project implementation
- iv) Facilitate collection and documentation of baseline information
- v) Continuous staffs refresher courses to be carried out.
- vi) Improvement of project managerial skills to community management committees.
- vii)Planning should be focused on wealth creating projects
- viii) Establishment of a collaborative framework for coordinating various development service providers in the agriculture sector.
- ix) Staff recruitment.

2.6.4 Implementation Challenges

The above achievements have not been without challenges:

- Lengthy procurement processes have slowed the rate of implementation of programmes.
- Inadequate budgetary allocations to the ministry have led to inadequate supplying of essential medical commodities and scaling down of development projects.
- Severe staff shortage has hampered service delivery in our health care facilities.

2.7.7 Implementation challenges

- In conducting a market survey, it emerged that there are open air markets with no toilets. This is a health hazard to the public. Several markets also do not have stock yards and traders sell and buy the livestock by the roadside which is a danger to both the traders and the animals.
- Market development committees are not yet in place in most markets.
- The financial year ended when ICT equipment had not been procured for the Ministries and Internet services were not available in all departments
- Most departments within the Ministry do not have reliable vehicles
- Inadequate staffing within the Ministry is affecting service delivery
- Poor network coverage and hindrance to online sacco services
- The markets department has no staff that makes it challenging to operate effectively
- Lack of means of mobility/transport for official operations
- Inadequate funding to carry most of the activities e.g. follow up of loans, verification of weighing and measuring instruments
- Most producer business groups face challenges of getting access to information on marketing and value addition

2.7.8 Recommendations

- Physical planning should set aside land for livestock yard in most markets.
- There is need for pit latrines to be constructed in all the open air markets.

- There is need to renovate the existing market structures, toilets and fence the open air markets.
- Market management committees need to be strengthened and their capacity built from time to time through training.
- Follow ups will be made to address all the issues identified during stakeholders' meeting. Any issue that may not be addressed adequately by the Ministry because it falls outside its mandate will be channeled to the relevant Ministry immediately.
- Staffing would continue to remain an issue but the investment in ICT would enhance the performance of existing staff. However, there is also need to rationalize the existing staff level so that areas that are seriously affected can be boosted.
- There is a need to support the MSE in financial and non financial ways. Improvement of the working conditions of the MSEs by building decent sheds in all the sub-counties and major commercial centers would be of much help. Development of proper policies for the growth of the sector is important as well.
- There is need for a well laid procurement plan which should be fast-tracked from time to time to get around the long procurement procedures
- There is need to enhance public-private partnerships in some of the future investments that shall be undertaken
- Stakeholders' forums should be held across the county plans put in place to address the challenges identified during these forums because certain problems cut across.
- Systems need to be put in place for easening access to resources by project implementers
- Official transport should be availed for the worker

2.8.6 Challenges

- The vastness and remoteness of some areas within the county hence poor accessibility and poor network coverage
- Unperceived delays from the Treasury department leading to cancellation and sometimes delays in initiating programmes
- Inadequacy of transport and logistical arrangements to facilitate speedy movement between the office and field activities
- Lack of office space and Equipment was a major drawback. Upto noew furniture and computers/printers have not been procured.
- Lack of clear guidelines on devolved functions/seconded staff from National Government. This has at times led to duplication and at times confusion. Especially functions associated with Probation, Youth, children, Social services and Gender.

2.8.7 Recommendations

- Speedy processing of imprests: The finance department to implement strategies for speedy processing of imprests to avoid delays.
- Communication: There should be established a smooth mechanism for information flow inter and intra ministerial.

- Clarity of roles between National and County government need to be enhanced. This would be possible if an interface is established where work plans and budgets can be shared to avoid duplication and confusion.

• Staff in the ministry were drawn from different career backgrounds and had training gaps in project planning, administration, implementation, monitoring and evaluation

- There were constant interruptions from planning and coordination ministries as this was basically a planning year and the format were repeatedly being improved upon for the county government hence ministry programmes would not run smoothly
- A lot of time was spent in developing county and ministerial development plans taking away implementation time
- There were delays from the finance and procurement departments due to unrefined processes and procedures
- The ministry had serious challenges on transport as it has no own vehicle for field and official programmes

- The lean staff in the ministry requires continuous capacity building to be more effective in project planning and implementation
- There should be a generic template for every plan being development and which should remain unaltered for appreciable length of time
- New staff and introduction of new programmes call for constant induction/training for effective delivery of services

- There is need to streamline operations in finance and procurement services to make it more effective and efficient
- Equip the ministry with vehicles for field and official service

CHAPTER FOUR

RECOMMENDATIONS AND THE WAY FORWARD

4.0 Introduction

This chapter presents the general recommendations cited after implementing projects and programmes in 2013/2014 financial year. These recommendations will be used as lessons to the implementation of planned projects and programmes for 2014/2015 financial year. The chapter also highlights afew concluding remarks to the plan. It lastly annexes a few appendices of importance which may not necessarily be captured as part of the main document; these would include the essential statistics, ward population and Kitui county map showing the 40 electoral wards.

4.1 Recommendations

- There is need to plan and undertake a comprehensive civic education programme to the community to create awareness on the issues of devolution, more specifically on the understanding of the County government taking the role of claim givers while the public being claim holders. The public should also be made aware that all rights are accompanied by equal responsibility.
- Intensive capacity building should be carried to officers especially on project designs, planning and monitoring and evaluation.
- Staffing gaps should be closed by recruiting relevant technical officers. Human needs assessment should produce optimal solutions to staffing gaps in the county.
- Derivation of chapter 3 on planned projects and programmes for 2014/2015 financial year was basically from the 2014/2015 financial year budget. It is provided in law that recurrent and development votes should maintain certain proportions. 2013/2014 financial year budget attained 60/40 percentage respectively. The 2014/2015 financial year budget attained 49/51 percent. It is therefore recommended that those proportions should be maintained or else raised. This will minimise wastage of resources and channel planned funds to development.
- Effective Implementation of projects and programmes needs sufficient logistical support. Transport, ICT equipment and others should be provided to ministries to ensure that implementation of developments projects is well done.
- Communication within and outside ministries is key to smooth execution of development activities. It is therefore recommended that there should be effective inter and intra ministerial communication.
- Facilitating departments like finance and procurement should streamline their operations to ensure efficiency and effectiveness.

4.2 Conclusion

Lessons learnt from the analysis of this plan will inform future implementation of projects and programmes. Distribution of development projects and programmes shows that the principles equity and fairness are upheld in the county. If the same planning continues, it will eventually ensure balance in regional development within the county as is envisaged in the Kenya Constitution 2010. At the impact level of evaluation, Kitui County will ultimately achieve its

vision of being a prosperous county having vibrant rural and urban economies; this will facilitate a high quality of life for the people.
